## Write your Will for free using the Free Will Service

Our Free Will Service is for anyone aged 18 or over. We cover the cost of a simple Will, and most people who use it choose to include a gift to Cancer Research UK. Here are a few things to think about if you decide to leave us a gift in your Will.

#### Minimising inheritance tax liability

If you leave a charitable gift in your Will, you may be able to reduce, or even eliminate your inheritance tax liability. Gifts to charities are 100% tax-free and are taken out of your estate before tax is calculated.

Since April 2017, if you leave 10% of your net estate, after certain deductions, your inheritance tax rate will be reduced from 40% to 36%. Please be aware that these rates are subject to change.

If this sounds like something you might want to consider, we recommend talking to your Will-writing service provider or HMRC for further advice.

### Frequently asked questions

### Does Cancer Research UK cover the cost of any Will?

As a charity, we have to consider carefully how we spend every penny of our money. We have fixed fees for the service agreed with our members which cover the cost of simple Wills.

You may be liable to pay any costs which exceed this agreed limit.
Please discuss this with your Willwriting service provider before you use the Free Will Service.

### What are the different types of gifts I can leave in my Will?

The most common types of gift people leave to us in their Will are a percentage share of an estate (residuary gifts) or specific amounts of money (pecuniary gifts). A residuary gift is the most reliable way to ensure your gift retains its intended value and isn't affected by inflation.

People also choose to leave us specific gifts, like jewellery, stocks and shares, or a property.

### Why does Cancer Research UK pay for Wills?

Cancer Research UK pays for supporters to write a 'simple' Will, mirror Will, single Codicil or mirror Codicil, as removing the need for supporters to pay for their Will helps to drive income.

### Can anyone use the Free Will Service?

Anyone aged 18 or over can make use of the service to settle their affairs and help beat cancer for future generations.
